Report Highlights:

On April 9, 2022, the Sri Lankan government issued the Imports and Exports (Control) Regulations No. 06 (2022). These regulations affect several food and non-food commodities. Food and agricultural products impacted by the measure include fish and fish products; dairy products; fruits (fresh and dried); cereal grains; starches; chocolate and other foods containing cocoa; pasta; couscous; fruit juices; prepared cereals; beers, wines, and spirits; and tobacco. An importer intent on importing any of the food and agricultural products specified in the Import and Export (Control) Regulations No. 06 (2022) must have a valid license issued by the Controller General of Imports and Exports Control prior to the shipped-on board date of the bill of lading/airway bill of the consignment. The licensing fee varies by commodity and is assessed on cost-insurance-freight (CIF) basis. The government has introduced quantitative and price restrictions on imports to discourage the import of non-essential commodities.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Sri Lankan government started revising its import control regulations on March 19, 2020. It initially sought to mitigate the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. Subsequently it has sought to limit the outflow of foreign exchange reserves. The government is introducing quantitative and price restrictions on imports to discourage the import of non-essential commodities.

The pandemic, with the drop in international travel, crippled the country's tourism-dependent economy, which until then had been a key source of foreign hard currency. At the same time imports had been on the rise along with large debt servicing costs resulting from loose fiscal policy and significant heavy foreign exchange borrowing. These factors compounded by the spike of international oil prices, a critical import commodity for petroleum-poor Sri Lanka, as well as rising U.S. interest rates, were too much for the Central Bank of Sri Lanka to defend the Sri Lankan rupee (LKR) against global pressures. The value of the local currency fell by around 44 percent in 2022. Economic crisis led to political crisis, resulting in the resignation (July 13) of President Gotabaya Rajapaksa.

Background:

On April 9, 2022, the Sri Lankan government issued the <u>Imports and Exports (Control) Regulations No.</u> 06 (2022). These regulations affect several food and non-food commodities. Food and agricultural products impacted by the measure include fish and fish products; dairy products; fruits (fresh and dried); cereal grains; starches; chocolate and other foods containing cocoa; pasta; couscous; fruit juices; prepared cereals; beers, wines, and spirits; and tobacco (see, Appendix I).

The regulation is applicable to those consignments shipped with a bill of lading/airway bill dated on or after April 10, 2022. A license is required for the import of goods specified in the regulations and is subject to the approval of the Secretary to the Ministry of Finance. An importer intent on importing any of the food and agricultural products specified in the **Import and Export (Control) Regulations No. 06**

¹ Gotabaya Rajapaksa's newly elected government on November 27, 2019, dropped the value-added-tax (VAT) from 15 percent to 8 percent (effective December 1, 2019). It eliminated seven other taxes, including a 2 percent nation building tax that had been paid by the business sector as well as exempted all religious institutions from taxes.

² Foreign reserves plummeted to \$1.93 billion in March 2022, down from \$2 billion the previous month. Sri Lanka's outstanding sovereign debt was over \$7 billion before it defaulted on April 12, 2022 (except for debt to multilateral agencies such as the World Bank). The International Monetary Fund (IMF) in September 2022, approved Sri Lanka a \$2.9 billion bailout package over four years pending Sri Lanka's ability to restructure its debt with creditors – including both bilateral and sovereign bond holders.

In introducing import control license fees, the Sri Lankan government aims to control the volume of non-essential food and non-food commodities entering the country. Domestic prices for the commodities falling under the import control license scheme are anticipated to increase; with the intent of encouraging domestic production. The Sri Lankan government aims to better allocate limited foreign exchange resources for imports of essential commodities such as fuel (i.e., gasoline and diesel fuel) and raw materials essential for domestic manufacturing and export processing.
