Updates to Qatar approved certificates for shelf-stable products include the U.S. Food and Drug Administration's Certificate to a Foreign Government: Food for Human Consumption.

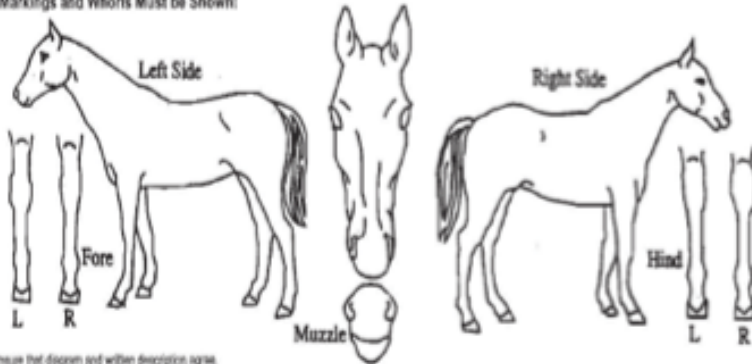

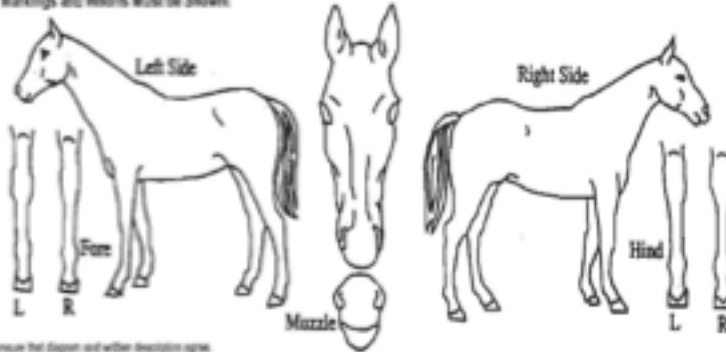
