Report Highlights:

Colombia has launched a new electronic platform for registering foods and beverages for human consumption. The system, InvimAgil, will be phased in under the coming months; currently, the use of the system is not mandatory. However, U.S. companies are encouraged to register on InvimAgil to receive further instructions and avoid delays when the new system becomes fully operational. Launch of New Product Registry System, InvimAgil

On May 8, 2025, Colombia's National Institute for the Surveillance of Drugs and Foods (INVIMA) issued Circular 1000-006-2025 (see attachment). The circular announced the launch of its new electronic platform for sanitary registries of food and beverages destined for human consumption and intended to be commercialized and sold in Colombia. The name of this platform is InvimAgil.

With this new platform, INVIMA aims to digitalize and speed-up Colombia's process for sanitary registries from months to days. Once implemented for food products, INVIMA expects to extend the new registration system to other products, such as cosmetics, medical devices and medicines. For now, INVIMA has not specified the date when the platform will become mandatory for users to apply, amend, or renew sanitary registries, permits, or sanitary notification for these products. Therefore, food companies can still apply, renew, or amend their sanitary registries according to the in-force procedure set in <u>Resolution 2674 of 2013</u> and <u>Resolution 719 of 2015</u> (see <u>FAIRS Country Report Annual CO2024-0024</u>).

Steps to Register in InvimAgil

U.S. companies are encouraged to start the registration process on InvimAgil. This will allow them to receive notifications on next steps to successfully migrate their existing sanitary registries to the new system once the platform is fully operational. INVIMA has not provided a date at which companies will be required to migrate fully to the InvimAgil platform. Companies from the food and beverage industry may access InvimAgil through the following link and register by creating a user and a password. Later, INVIMA will communicate next steps to continue with the transition to InvimAgil. No fees are generated for the registration process. U.S. companies are encouraged to review the information posted online by INVIMA on InvimAgil, including training for the new platform.
