<sup>1</sup> According to Thai FDA/MoPH No. 420, “make” refers to any act of manufacturing or processing food, including but not limited to thermal treatment, such as cooking or pasteurization. The phrase “make, mix, prepare and re-packing” is used as a catch-all to cover all active production operations (e.g., mixing, forming, filling, cooking, freezing, drying, marinating, repacking), whether or not heat is used, and any food subjected to these processes must come from a GMP-compliant establishment and be accompanied by an appropriate GMP-type certificate at import.

## Section II. Specific Attestations Required on Export Certificate(s)

- For specific attestations for meat and poultry products, please consult the [FSIS Export Library for Thailand](#).
- For Food derived from genetically modified organisms (GM plant, animal, and microorganisms)
  - o Self-Verified Document from the manufacturer or exporter - Specific statement:
  - o *“This shipment of (name of plant or animal or microorganism) may contain genetically modified events as following....” OR “adheres to MOPH Ministerial Notification No. 431.” OR other statement with a similar meaning including the contact information of the importing party.*
- For alcoholic beverages, accompanying certificate needs to include this statement:
  - o For Wine - Specific statement:  
*“The product described above is intended for direct human consumption, complies with the conditions governing the production and entry into circulation applicable in the United States of America, has been produced using oenological practices in accordance with the Laws and Regulations of Thailand, in particular with regard to the Thai limits for alcohol content, acetaldehyde, methyl alcohol, ethyl carbamate, sulfur dioxide, benzoic acid, sorbic acid, arsenic, lead, and ferrocyanide. This product has also been produced by a winery licensed by the Alcohol and Tobacco Tax and Trade Bureau for the production of wine.*
  - o For Beer - Specific statement:  
*“The product described below has been produced in accordance with the laws and regulations of Thailand, in particular with regard to the Thai limits for alcohol content, methyl alcohol, ethyl carbamate, sulfur dioxide, arsenic, lead, copper, and iron.”*
  - o For Distilled Spirits - Specific statement:  
*“The product described below has been produced in accordance with the laws and regulations of Thailand, in particular with regard to the Thai limits for alcohol content, fuel oil, furfural, acetaldehyde, methyl alcohol, ethyl carbamate, benzoic acid, sorbic acid, arsenic, and lead.”*
- For Feed – Plant-Based Feed Ingredients
  - o Distillers Dried Grains, FGIS should issue Form 921-2 with the following in the remarks section:
    - *“The inspected lot complies with the conditions for export of DDGS from the United States to Thailand*
    - *Fumigation city and state*
    - *Form of fumigant (pellets, tablets, plates, cylinderized gas)”*
- For Hides and Skins, APHIS should issue the VS Form 16-4 with the following in the “Additional Declaration” section:
  - o *This is to certify that rinderpest, foot-and-mouth disease, classical swine fever, swine vesicular disease, African swine fever, and contagious bovine pleuropneumonia do not exist in the United States of America.*
  - o *This office has on file a notarized affidavit from [company/manufacturer] verifying the accuracy of the statements below:*
  - o *The products originate from animals which:*

1. *Have shown no signs of anthrax during ante-mortem and post-mortem inspections;*
2. *Come from establishments which are not placed under quarantine on account of anthrax control.*

### **Section III. Government Certificate Legal Entry Requirements**

Thailand accepts an original U.S. state-issued export certificate or a copy of such certificate when the document is officially certified by (i) the issuing agencies or (ii) carry the original seal of a U.S. Notary Public, Chamber of Commerce, Commissioner of Oaths, or a Justice of Peace<sup>3</sup>.

### **Section IV. Other Certification/ Accreditation Requirements to Ensure Market Entry**

1. The original certificate of origin must accompany the product at the time of entry.
2. Certificate of Free Sale/Certificate of Health and Sanitation/Export Certificate (GMP Certificate)
  - a. The certificate is valid for dates indicated on that certificate, otherwise valid for one year and can be applied to multiple shipments of an identical product.
  - b. Thailand does not accept a Suppliers or Manufacturers Export Declaration as proof of compliance.
  - c. Thailand accepts e-certificate, original certificate or copies of export certificates accompanying U.S.-origin imported foods. However, TFDA requires copies of export certificates to (i) be certified by the issuing agencies or (ii) carry the original seal of a U.S. Notary Public, Chamber of Commerce, Commissioner of Oaths, or a Justice of Peace.<sup>5</sup>
3. Certificate of Origin
  - a. The certificate shall be valid for 12 months from the date of its issuance.
  - b. The certificate must be submitted to the Customs Authority of the importing Party within its validity period; if it has expired, Customs will normally not grant preferential duty unless a force-majeure exception applies under that agreement's rule.
4. FSIS Form 9060-5
  - a. The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.
  - b. The certificate is valid only for the particular shipment.
  - c. The plant number specified must correlate with the letterhead certificate and the USDA Export Verification document. The selected statements will be added by PHIS in the remarks continuation page, FSIS Form 9060-5B.
  - d. Letterhead Certificate
    - i. The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.
    - ii. The certificate is valid only for the particular shipment.
    - iii. The plant number specified must correlate with the letterhead certificate and the USDA Export Verification document.
    - iv. Effective for all meat and poultry export certificates approved, signed, and issued on or after March 6, 2023, the below FSIS Letterhead Certificates will no longer be signed and issued by FSIS IPP. Instead, the export applicant will select the

equivalent statements via the PHIS statements module when completing the export application in PHIS.

- v. The selected statements will be added by PHIS in the remarks continuation page, FSIS Form 9060-5B.
  
- e. Thailand accepts an original U.S. state issued export certificate or copy of such certificate when the document is officially certified by (i) the issuing agencies or (ii) carry the original seal of a U.S. Notary Public, Chamber of Commerce, Commissioner of Oaths, or a Justice of Peace<sup>3</sup>.

## 5. Distillers Dried Grain

### a. Certificate of Origin

- i. The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.

### b. Phytosanitary Certificate

- i. The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.
- ii. The certificate is valid as indicated on that certificate, otherwise valid for the indicated shipment. The certificate must be endorsed by the United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS).
- iii. DDGS must be treated with Phosphine or Methyl Bromide. The Checklist for Official Inspection of DDGS to Thailand applies to Phosphine only.

#### Consignments fumigated with Phosphine:

The FGIS Checklist for Official Inspection of DDGS to Thailand Fumigated with Phosphine (see Supporting Documents) will be completed by FGIS.

1. Once FGIS verifies all requirements have been met, FGIS will issue a 921-2 with the following information in the remarks section:
  - a. Statement that "The inspected lot complies with the conditions for export of DDGS from the United States to Thailand."
  - b. Fumigation city and state.
  - c. Form of fumigant (pellets, tablets, plates, cylinderized gas).  
Fumigation dosage is expressed in "grams per 1000 cubic feet" on the 921-2. The exporter needs only to present the 921-2.
2. The ACO must include the following on the Phytosanitary Certificate:
  - a. Additional Declaration that "This consignment complies with the phytosanitary conditions for export of DDGS from the United States to Thailand."
  - b. Block 6 of treatment information list "City and State" where fumigation occurred and form of fumigant (i.e. Savannah, GA; pellets).
  - c. Block 5 of treatment information list fumigation dosage expressed in "Parts Per Million by Volume (PPMV)" (even though dosage is in "grams per cubic meter" on the 921-2). However, for bulk DDG in ship holds, there is no monitoring of gas concentration, so when metal phosphide is used, Block 5 dosage should be expressed as "Grams per Cubic Meter (gm/m<sup>3</sup>) for a minimum of 750 ppmv" Alternatively, when cylinderized gas is used, the ppmv value alone may be used.

Consignments fumigated with Methyl Bromide:

1. Once FGIS verifies all requirements have been met, FGIS will issue a 921-2 with the following information in the remarks section:
    - a. Statement that "The inspected lot complies with the conditions for export of DDGS from the United States to Thailand."
    - b. Fumigation city and state. Fumigation dosage is expressed in "grams per cubic meter" on the 921-2. The exporter needs only to present the 921-2.
  2. The ACO must include the following on the Phytosanitary Certificate:
    - c. Additional Declaration that, "This consignment complies with the phytosanitary conditions for export of DDGS from the United States to Thailand."
    - d. Block 6 of treatment information list "City and State" where fumigation occurred and form of fumigant (i.e. Savannah, GA; cylinderized gas).
    - e. Block 5 of treatment information list fumigation dosage expressed in "grams per cubic meter."
- iv. For attestation, please refer to the AHPIS USDA Phytosanitary Certificate Issuance & Tracking System (PCIT) for Thailand.

**6. Fruit and Vegetable<sup>6</sup>**

a. Phytosanitary Certificate

- i. The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.
- ii. The certificate is valid as indicated on that certificate, otherwise valid for the indicated shipment. The certificate must be endorsed by the United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS). Thailand does not accept a Suppliers or Manufacturers Export Declaration as proof of compliance.
- iii. Thailand does not accept a U.S. State issued export certificate.
- iv. For attestation, please refer to the AHPIS USDA Phytosanitary Certificate Issuance & Tracking System (PCIT) for Thailand.

b. Production Standard Certificate

- i. The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.
- ii. Samples of production standards that are equivalent to the standard of good handling practice of fresh fruits and vegetables:
  1. Code of Hygienic Practice for Fresh Fruits and Vegetables: CAC/RCP 53-2003
  2. Hazard Analysis and Critical Control Point System
  3. BRC Global Standard for Food Safety: British Retail Consortium.
  4. Food Safety Management Systems – Requirements for any Organization in the Food Chain, ISO 22000: 2005

<sup>6</sup> A notarized copy of the three certificates can be used in lieu of the original certificate. After the first shipment, shippers or importers are allowed to present a copy of the notarized copy at the time of the shipment clearance as long as the dates indicated in the certificate are valid. The Thai Food and Drug Administration is usually willing to revise its list of approved standards upon an official report of exporting countries.

## 7. Hides and Skins

### a. Health Certificate

- i. The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.
- ii. The certificate is valid as indicated on that certificate.
- iii. Thailand accepts an original U.S. State issued export certificate or copy of such certificate when the document is officially certified by (i) the issuing agencies or (ii) carry the original seal of a U.S. Notary Public, Chamber of Commerce, Commissioner of Oaths, or Justice of Peace<sup>3</sup>.
- iv. Thailand does not accept a Suppliers or Manufacturers Export Declaration as proof of compliance.

## 8. Live Animals

### a. Animal Health Certificate

- i. The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.
- ii. The certificate is valid as indicated on that certificate, otherwise valid for the indicated shipment.
- iii. The certificate must be endorsed by APHIS. Thailand does not accept a Suppliers or Manufacturers Export Declaration as proof of compliance.
- iv. Thailand does not accept a U.S. State issued export certificate.

## 9. Other Processed Meat Products

### a. Meat and Poultry Export Certificate of wholesomeness Certificate (FSIS Form 9060-5)

- i. The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.
- ii. The certificate is valid only for the particular shipment.
- iii. Thailand accepts an original U.S. State issued export certificate or copy of such certificate when the document is officially certified by (i) the issuing agencies or (ii) carry the original seal of a U.S. Notary Public, Chamber of Commerce, Commissioner of Oaths, or Justice of Peace<sup>5</sup>. For attestation, please refer to FSIS Export Library: Meat, Poultry, and Eggs Export Requirements for Thailand at: <https://www.fsis.usda.gov/inspection/import-export/import-export-library/thailand>
- iv. Letterhead Certificate via PHIS system

## 10. Seafood Products (Chilled, Frozen, and Processed)

### a. Certificate of Sanitation & Free Sale

- i. The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.
- ii. The certificate is valid as indicated on that certificate, otherwise valid for one year. The certificate can also be applied to multiple shipments of the identical product.
- iii. Thailand accepts an original U.S. State issued export certificate or copy of such certificate when the document is officially certified by (i) the issuing agencies or (ii) carry the original seal of a U.S. Notary Public, Chamber of Commerce, Commissioner of Oaths, or Justice of Peace<sup>3</sup>.
- iv. Thailand does not accept a Suppliers or Manufacturers Export Declaration as proof of compliance.

## 11. Food Derived from GM Plant, Animal, and Microorganisms<sup>7</sup>

### a. Analytical Report

- i. The original export certificate or document needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.
- ii. GM events listed in the certificate or document must match with Positive List (Annex 1) or the Temporary Approval List (Annex 6) of Ministerial Notification No.431 B.E. 2565 (2022) RE: Foods Derived from the Genetically Modified.
- iii. The analytical report must be issued by a government laboratory from the country of origin, a government laboratory in Thailand or a private laboratory accredited by the Thai government.

### b. Certificate of Analysis (COA)

- i. The original export certificate or document needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.
- ii. GM events listed in the certificate or document must match with Positive List (Annex 1) or the Temporary Approval List (Annex 6) of Ministerial Notification No.431 B.E. 2565 (2022) RE: Foods Derived from the Genetically Modified.
- iii. The COA must be for a specific silo/batch issued by a government laboratory from the country of origin, a government laboratory in Thailand or a private laboratory accredited by the Thai government.

### c. Phytosanitary Certificate

- i. The original export certificate or document needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.

<sup>7</sup> Processed food that contains GM plant, animal, and microorganisms (e.g., canned corn, corn soup, smoked salmon fillet, seasoned fried salmon skin, and yeast extract) that were registered with the Thai FDA and imported or sold in Thailand before December 4, 2022, are exempted from providing additional import documents for Thai FDA inspection at the port of entry. However, such food products must comply with Ministerial Notification No.431 B.E. 2565 (2022) RE: Foods Derived from the Genetically Modified. The Thai FDA will conduct random checks to determine whether events contained in the imported food products match the events listed in the positive and temporary approval lists.

  - iii. The health certificate must specify the events and/or traits or OECD unique identifier or must specify the absence of any unauthorized GM.




