Report Highlights:

This report identifies certificate requirements for U.S. food and agricultural products destined for the United Arab Emirates. This report is to be used in conjunction with the 2025 Food and Agricultural Import Regulations and Standards Country Report for the United Arab Emirates.

DISCLAIMER

This report was prepared by the USDA Foreign Agricultural Service office in Dubai, United Arab Emirates (UAE), for U.S. exporters of food and agricultural products. Agricultural products entering the UAE are subject to the country's federal food regulations and standards governing the importation and sale of such goods. Although thorough investigation was taken in preparation of this report, UAE import requirements are subject to change, often without official notice. It is recommended that U.S. exporters verify the full set of import requirements with their foreign customers before goods are shipped. Final import approval of any product is subject to the importing country's rules and regulations as interpreted by border officials at the time of product entry.

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Executive Summary:

The Government of the United Arab Emirates (UAE) requires an export certificate from a recognized government authority in the country of origin to accompany all exported shipments. Export certificates issued directly by U.S. suppliers are not accepted. Certificates issued by the following U.S. government agencies have been negotiated and approved by the UAE government: The United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS), the USDA's Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS), the USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS), and the United States Department of Commerce's National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA)

Additionally, the "Certificate to a Foreign Government: Food for Human Consumption" issued by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is accepted, provided it includes additional information linking the certificate to the specific shipment. Certificates of Free Sale or Health Certificates issued by state-level Departments of Agriculture or Health are also accepted.

For products labeled as organic or GMO-free, only a USDA Organic certificate is required. Furthermore, if a product label includes any specific claims, especially health claims, these claims must be supported by appropriate documentation, including certificates that verify the claims.

Section III. Government Certificate Legal Entry Requirements

1. For all certificates mentioned in section I:
 - 1.1. The original certificate must accompany the product at the time of entry for the inspection. A shipment receives final release once the importer submits original certificates.
 - 1.2. The certificate is valid as indicated on each certificate.
 - 1.3. The certificate is valid only for the accompanied shipment and cannot be transferred.
2. For products regulated by FDA:
 - 2.1. Firms exporting products from the United States are often asked by foreign customers or foreign governments to supply a written export certification for products regulated by the

U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA). FDA may provide this certification in a form the agency determines appropriate. For food products, FDA provides written certification for exports in the form of certificates and lists of eligible exporters for specific products or destinations.

- 2.3. For certain exported food products, some foreign food safety authorities require certification in the form of publicly available lists of establishments eligible for export. For more information on FDA Food Export Lists go to FDA's website for Food Export Lists.

- 2.5. Certificate of free sale or health and sanitary certificate issued by U.S. state departments of agriculture or health are accepted by the UAE if they include information to link it to the shipment. For example, this includes container number, invoice number, production dates, expiration date, lot number, quantity, and any other information to link the certificate with the shipment. In addition, the certificate should include the statement "the product(s) is fit for human consumption."
- 2.6. Suppliers or manufacturers and U.S. Chamber of Commerce Export Declarations of food safety are not accepted by UAE authorities.
- 2.7. The following information should be included on the certificate:
 - Letterhead and address of issuing authority
 - Title of document
 - Certificate number
 - Date of issue
 - Exporter and importer name
 - Item description
 - Quantity and weight
 - Production and expiration dates
 - Fitness for human consumption
 - Authorized signature and stamp
3. Halal Certificate as indicated in section I:
 - 3.1. Only halal certificates issued by UAE-approved halal certifiers are accepted. For more information and the list of approved U.S. halal certifiers, please check the UAE FAIRS

- 3.2. The following attestation should be mentioned on the certificate, "this is to certify that the meat accompanying this certificate is halal meat which derived from lawful animals that were slaughter according to Islamic rites."

 - Certifier's official stamp
4. The United Arab Emirates government does not require attestation of radioactivity for imports.
