Report Highlights:

No new bilateral certificates were negotiated from the second half of 2024 through the first half of 2025. The Export Certificate Matrix includes only bilaterally negotiated certificates. From 2021-2025, Ukraine introduced generic certificates for products of animal origin and sample certificates for live animals and reproductive materials. These certificates can be endorsed by the exporting country's authorities without additional negotiations. The lists of generic and sample import certificates were added to the report as an attachment. Instructions for exporters of FDA-regulated products have been added as a separate attachment.

• <i>International Certificate</i>	10
The international certificate is defined by Law 2042 (in Ukrainian) as a “health certificate, international veterinary certificate or any other document issued by the exporting country that certifies the safety of a food product, feed, hay, straw, or animal byproduct.” The definition of the international certificate creates an “umbrella” definition for a family of different certificates. Ukrainian legislation contains specific separate definitions for the majority of those (such as veterinary or phytosanitary certificates). However, there is no particular definition for an international certificate required for food products of plant origin. The Law only requires an international certificate issued by the competent authority of the country of origin. In the United States, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) issues these international certificates (the Certificate to a Foreign Government). Additional information as to the International Certificate for Processed Food Products is provided in Appendix IV.	10
• <i>Veterinary-Sanitary Certificate</i>	11
Veterinary Certificates are certificates issued in the country of export in accordance with the instructions of the relevant international organizations and certify the state of animal health and/or compliance with human health requirements for exported goods. Ukraine requires this certificate for imports of live animals, reproductive materials, products of animal origin, fish and seafood, and composite products. The purpose of the veterinary certificate required by the SSUFSCP’s Department for Food Safety and Veterinary is to clearly identify the imported product, means and route of transportation, packaging, consignee, and consignor as well as to certify the epizootic/disease status of the country, state, premise, and allotment of the imported item. An importer must present a valid bilaterally negotiated veterinary certificate or a generic certificate issued by the competent authority of the country of origin.	11
• <i>Generic and Sample Veterinary-Sanitary Certificates</i>	11
In 2021, generic and sample certificates became an important part of Ukraine’s regulatory landscape and the SSUFSCP-preferred import certification. U.S. competent authorities are expected to inspect and analyze those certificates prior to initiating further negotiations. In 2020, Ukraine introduced 72 generic certificates covering a wide variety of meat and meat products (including processed products from domestic animals and wild game), seafood, feed of animal and plant origin for pets and productive animals, milk (including raw milk) and dairy products, byproducts of animal origin for human consumption, feed and industrial use, hides, skins, feathers, horns, hooves, and similar products, different fats and lard, hay, straw, manure, cartilage, glues of animal origin, and selected amino acids. Individual links to these generic certificate forms are provided in Appendix II of this report. Additionally, Ukraine adopted 20 sample certificates for live animals and nine certificates for reproductive materials (animal genetics, embryos, and hatching eggs; link in Ukrainian).	

Certificates for live animals and reproductive materials contain all import requirements in the texts and do not require additional research and verifications with other Ukrainian laws and regulations. As of 2024, certification of live animals and reproductive materials are regulated differently from food products of animal origin, composed products, and feeds, and SSUFSCP differentiates between “generic” and “sample” certificates. Individual links to all sample certificate forms are in Appendix IV of this report. 11

At their discretion, the exporting country’s competent authorities can endorse generic and sample certificates. Forms must be endorsed “as is” without amendments. Although not clearly defined in the Ukrainian legal field, generic certificates represent certificate forms that list all Ukrainian import requirements for a specific product or product group. These import requirements were adopted by Order 553 (in Ukrainian) in November 2019, and generic certificates should reflect these requirements and other previously adopted laws and regulations. Some of those regulations are extensive and not available in English..... 12

- *Phytosanitary Certificates*..... 12

The SSUFSCP’s Department for Phytosanitary Safety requires that a phytosanitary certificate (PPQ Form 577) issued by APHIS accompany each shipment of plant products. The purpose of this certificate is to confirm the U.S. origin plants or plant products have been inspected according to appropriate procedures and are considered free from quarantine pests and conform to Ukrainian phytosanitary import requirements. 12

Ukraine requires a phytosanitary certificate for products of plant origin that could serve as the transmission pathway for plant-borne pests and diseases. HS Codes for products that must be accompanied by a phytosanitary certificate can be found in the relevant list available in Ukrainian. The quarantine pests list, including their Latin names, is available here (in Ukrainian). Ukraine uses the “Attachment Sheet for Phytosanitary Certificate or Phytosanitary Certificate for Re-export” (PPQ Form 576) when the required information for phytosanitary certification does not fit on the original phytosanitary certificate. 12

The SSUFSCP also requires a phytosanitary certificate for certain processed plant products. In this case, the phytosanitary certificate (PPQ Form 577) must accompany the shipment, as PPQ Form 578 is no longer endorsed by APHIS. This form attests that the processed plant product has been inspected by the U.S. Government and the shipment was processed or manufactured to the extent that there is negligible risk of harboring dangerous plant pests of specific concern to Ukraine. An exporter is advised to consult with an importer regarding the specific certificates required by Ukraine for each product..... 12

Executive Summary

All Ukrainian laws and regulations guiding commercial imports remain in place despite the Russia-Ukraine war, which began on February 24, 2022. All certificates listed in this report remain compulsory for imports. The FAIRS Annual Report provides detailed descriptions of regulatory changes.

The United States has 19 bilaterally negotiated certificates for products of animal origin, seafood, feed, live animals, day-old chicks, eggs, and genetics. Ukraine also maintains a list of [72 generic certificates](#) for food products, feeds, and animal by-products and a list of [29 sample certificates](#) for live animals and reproductive materials. All of these certificates can be endorsed by foreign competent authorities without prior negotiation. FAS/Kyiv is not aware of any acceptance of generic or sample certificates by U.S. competent authorities; however, one of the negotiated bilateral certificates is based on the text of the corresponding sample certificate. Ukrainian authorities distinguish between generic and sample certificates as they are based on a different set of regulations. Appendices II and III of this report have lists of generic and sample certificates with corresponding links to every certificate.

The Ukrainian regulatory system requires import certification to ensure the safety of live animals and reproductive materials, as well as freedom from certain diseases in the territory of the exporting country, administrative territory, or specific premise. In rare cases, the certificates require compliance with selected quality traits of imported foodstuffs of animal and plant origin. All import requirements are established by the Department for State Policy in the Sanitary and Phytosanitary Sphere of the Ministry of Agrarian Policy and Food of Ukraine; however, all certificates are negotiated with and verified by Ukraine's single food safety authority – the State Service of Ukraine on Food Safety and Consumer Protection (SSUFSCP).

Export certificate availability is a necessary but not a sufficient condition for product export to Ukraine. For information on overall Ukrainian food and agricultural product quality, safety and sanitation regulations, facility registration, labeling, packaging, documentation requirements, and some product-specific requirements, please refer to the most recent FAIRS Annual Report.

SECTION II. Specific Attestations Required on Export Certificate(s)

There are no known specific additional attestations required on export certificates beyond the standard attestations used in international trade. All attestation requirements are referred to in the third column of the Export Certificates Required by Government Matrix, with the exception of PPQ Form 577, which allows for certain deviations from the set text. Specific attestations regarding fumigation and pest-free status must be made in the appropriate section of the [PPQ Form 577](#). These import requirements depend on the plant or plant material and its origin within the United States.

Veterinary Certificate and Generic Veterinary Certificates

Bilaterally negotiated veterinary certificates and generic veterinary certificates attest the territory of the country, state, or premise being free from certain diseases. Furthermore, these certificates attest to the safety and wholesomeness of exported live animals, reproductive materials, animal feeds, composite products, fish and seafood, and food products of animal origin. The veterinary certificate may contain both statements regarding animal health and/or related to human health.

Bilaterally negotiated veterinary certificates prevail in cases when their provision differs from current import requirements or from provisions attested in official generic certificates.

FAS/Kyiv strongly encourages U.S. exporters to check the acceptability of any generic (not officially negotiated by competent authorities of Ukraine and the United States) certificate with their trading partners prior to product shipment.

SECTION III. Government Certificate Legal Entry Requirements

Ukrainian competent authorities require original certificates in paper format (to date, no special agreement on the acceptance of electronic import certificates has been reached) prior to or simultaneously with the products' arrival at the Ukrainian border crossing point.

All certificates indicated in Section I are required by various Ukrainian laws or agreements negotiated between the U.S. and Ukrainian governments. Ukraine accepts only certificates issued by the competent authority of the exporting country. For official control purposes, Ukraine does not accept “proxy” certificates, such as certificates of free sale or other certificates issued by commercial companies or non-governmental organizations. Ukraine does not recognize U.S. state-level authorities as competent authorities.

The certificates must accompany the shipment and be issued for each unified batch of product (see the most recent FAIRS Report for details; the 2025 FAIRS Country report will be available after publication. Please use the [GAIN Search Engine](#) to view it). Ukrainian authorities will delay customs clearance until all required original certificates are presented.

The exporter must ensure the production dates provided in the official certificate and those listed on the box labels meet Ukrainian requirements. It is highly recommended to contact your Ukrainian partners in order to find out the requirements for specific shipments and batches of exported goods. In most cases, products produced five days apart may be classified as those belonging to different batches and require different certificates.

Although Ukraine requires all certificates to be issued prior to departing the exporting country, in some cases, it allows for new certificates to be issued as “corrections” of the originally issued certificate. Although the law is designed to fix minor technical errors in the certificate, rather significant edits can be made as corrections. The importers are advised to contact FAS/Kyiv in case of certificate errors or for verification of certificate authenticity when requested.

Ukraine does not allow product re-export and does not accept “in lieu of” issued certificates. The products must remain in transit status throughout the entire route.

Shipment splits conducted in the third country’s custom bonded warehouses are not permitted unless the original export certificate can be presented. The “in lieu of” certificates issued by the third-country competent authority will not be accepted, even in cases when negotiated bilateral certificates with both (the country of origin and the country on the territory of which the split took place) exist. Notary-verified copies of the original certificate will not facilitate clearance, and SSUFSCP will reject the product.

Normally, for plant products, no more than 14 days should elapse from the date the product is inspected and form PPQ 577 is issued.

Import certification is required to be in one of the following forms:

- *International Certificate*

The international certificate is defined by Law [2042](#) (in Ukrainian) as a “health certificate, international veterinary certificate or any other document issued by the exporting country that certifies the safety of a food product, feed, hay, straw, or animal byproduct.” The definition of the international certificate creates an “umbrella” definition for a family of different certificates. Ukrainian legislation contains specific separate definitions for the majority of those (such as veterinary or phytosanitary certificates). However, there is no particular definition for an

international certificate required for food products of plant origin. The Law only requires an international certificate issued by the competent authority of the country of origin. In the United States, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) issues these international certificates (the Certificate to a Foreign Government). Additional information as to the International Certificate for Processed Food Products is provided in Appendix IV.

All required certificates must be presented to Ukraine's single competent authority –SSUFSCP. According to Ukraine's requirements, the international certificate is a document issued in line with recommendations from international organizations and by the competent authority of the country of origin. All certificates establishing the safety of fish and seafood, food products of plant and animal origin, animal byproducts, composite products, and feeds must be issued by the appropriate U.S. regulatory agencies with specific attestation requirements negotiated with Ukraine.

- *Veterinary-Sanitary Certificate*

Veterinary Certificates are certificates issued in the country of export in accordance with the instructions of the relevant international organizations and certify the state of animal health and/or compliance with human health requirements for exported goods. Ukraine requires this certificate for imports of live animals, reproductive materials, products of animal origin, fish and seafood, and composite products. The purpose of the veterinary certificate required by the SSUFSCP's Department for Food Safety and Veterinary is to clearly identify the imported product, means and route of transportation, packaging, consignee, and consignor as well as to certify the epizootic/disease status of the country, state, premise, and allotment of the imported item. An importer must present a valid bilaterally negotiated veterinary certificate or a generic certificate issued by the competent authority of the country of origin.

- *Generic and Sample Veterinary-Sanitary Certificates*

In 2021, generic and sample certificates became an important part of Ukraine's regulatory landscape and the SSUFSCP-preferred import certification. At their discretion, the exporting country's competent authorities can endorse generic and sample certificates. Forms must be endorsed "as is" without amendments. Although not clearly defined in the Ukrainian legal field, generic certificates represent certificate forms that list all Ukrainian import requirements for a specific product or product group. These import requirements were adopted by [Order 553](#) (in Ukrainian) in November 2019, and generic certificates should reflect these requirements and other previously adopted laws and regulations. Some of those regulations are extensive and not available in English.

Certain provisions of Order 553 restrict negotiations of new bilateral certificates between Ukraine and the United States. Generic and sample certificates remain the only option for products for which no bilateral certificate is negotiated. FAS/Kyiv is unaware of cases when U.S. competent authorities agreed to endorse generic or sample certificates "as is"; however, bilaterally negotiated certificates for hatching eggs and day-old chicks endorsed by USDA's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) closely resemble sample certificate texts.

To assist foreign competent authorities in assessing export product compliance with Ukrainian regulations, the SSUFSCP published information [online](#) that lists all Ukrainian regulations related to each generic certificate. However, the most recent reference regulation mentioned in the guidance is dated from 2019. As a result, it is missing many recent regulatory changes. At the time of this report, the Ukrainian guidance did not contain the most recent maximum residue levels for selected contaminants and recent Ukrainian labeling and packaging requirements. Moreover, all referenced regulations are in Ukrainian, which complicates the competent authority's ability to evaluate the requirements.

A U.S. exporter may approach the appropriate U.S. competent authority with a request to review and endorse a generic or sample (whichever is applicable) import certificate in cases when a bilateral certificate does not exist. However, a brief analysis of proposed generic certificates suggests that endorsement may be complicated.

- *Phytosanitary Certificates*

The SSUFSCP's Department for Phytosanitary Safety requires that a phytosanitary certificate ([PPQ Form 577](#)) issued by APHIS accompany each shipment of plant products. The purpose of this certificate is to confirm the U.S. origin plants or plant products have been inspected according to appropriate procedures and are considered free from quarantine pests and conform to Ukrainian phytosanitary import requirements.

Ukraine requires a phytosanitary certificate for products of plant origin that could serve as the transmission pathway for plant-borne pests and diseases. HS Codes for products that must be accompanied by a phytosanitary certificate can be found in the relevant list available [in Ukrainian](#). An exporter is advised to consult with an importer regarding the specific certificates required by Ukraine for each product.

SECTION IV. Other Certification/Accreditation Requirements to Ensure Market Entry

The Ukrainian government does not require a separate attestation of radioactivity for imported food products and feeds. However, all products must comply with Ukraine's maximum residue levels for ¹³⁷Cesium (¹³⁷Cs) and ⁹⁰Strontium (⁹⁰Sr). A separate FAIRS Subject Report, [Ukraine Radiation Contamination MRLs](#), provides information on radiological maximum residue limits for different products.

A bilaterally negotiated or generic import certificate issued by one of the U.S. competent authorities is a necessary and sufficient document for veterinary, sanitary, or phytosanitary clearance of imported products. Other certifications are auxiliary in nature. Post advises exporters to contact the importer to understand if those are of any value.

Food Safety and Wholesomeness Certificates Issued by the Producer

Food Safety and Wholesomeness Certificates may be issued for all processed food products intended for human consumption. The competent Ukrainian authority does not recognize producer-issued certificates as an "international certificate." Producer-issued food safety and wholesomeness certificates may accompany the competent authority's issued certificate to provide additional statements or testing results. FAS/Kyiv encourages U.S. exporters to contact their importers to determine whether such certification is of value.

Quality Certificates

A quality certificate is an auxiliary (non-compulsory) certificate designed to confirm that products meet certain quality standards. Although Ukrainian certification authorities still take product samples for testing, a quality certificate issued by a U.S. regulatory agency or a copy of an international standard organization (ISO) certificate for a production facility may expedite the clearance process in Ukraine. Although USDA Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS)-issued certificates will assure a higher level of recognition by the appropriate Ukrainian regulatory agencies compared with producer/supplier-issued certificates, those certificates will not replace required safety certifications as outlined in Section I. The exporter should contact their importer to determine whether such a certification is of value.

Certificate of Origin

The Certificate of Origin attests that imported products in a particular shipment originated from the United States. A certificate of origin may be requested by the State Customs Service of Ukraine. This certificate will be required when products in question fall under tariff rate quota import regulations or are subject to special preferential import duties. A written declaration of origin in the customs declaration will be sufficient in all other instances. As of June 2025, no U.S. agricultural and food products are subject to special import duty or import quotas.

From May 2024, Ukraine required special identification of the country of origin or place of provenance for fresh and frozen beef, pork and pork products, poultry (domestic chicken, ducks, geese, turkeys, and

guinea fowl) and products, honey, and unprocessed olive oil. Although related to certification of origin, Ukraine introduced these new requirements as labeling rules. A detailed GAIN Report on new requirements is available [here](#).

Organic Certificate

USDA's [Organic Export Certificate](#) forms issued by AMS are not officially recognized in Ukraine and cannot replace any other certificate required for import. Although Ukraine recognizes EU organic certification and there is [equivalency established](#) between EU and U.S. certifying agencies, the EU's "Green Leaf" logo must appear on U.S. products to be recognized as organic on the Ukrainian market.

There is a way to recognize a product as organic without the EU "Green Leaf" logo. According to Article 29 of the [Organic Law](#) (in Ukrainian), organic certificates issued by third countries will be recognized in Ukraine if the foreign certifier that issued the certificate is included in the Ukrainian registry of foreign certifiers. To get a new entity on the Ukrainian registry of foreign certifiers, an importer/exporter of organic products must apply to the SSUFSCP.

According to the Ukrainian [regulations](#) (in Ukrainian) governing the production and marketing of organic products, an importer should provide authorities with the following documents:

- list of organic products
- list all storage facilities alongside the supply lines of an organic product
- list of suppliers for organic products
- copies of organic certificates

Exporters should ship organic products in tamper-proof packaging or containers that prevent unauthorized swaps of non-organic products. The shipped products should also have specific labels for batch identification purposes.

In all cases, only the statements found in the certificates and the form numbers will be available to a viewer. FSIS and APHIS have not posted samples of the actual certificate to prevent certificate forgeries. The SSUFSCP has adopted the same approach.

APPENDIX IV. Instructions for Exporters of FDA-Regulated Dairy Products to Other Export Markets:

The Agricultural Marketing Service's Dairy Program is responsible for issuing dairy export certificates accepted by most countries. [This website](#) provides information on these certificates. APHIS issues export certificates for a limited number of countries, including Ukraine. [This website](#) contains information on APHIS export certificates.

Ukrainian regulations tend to demand a clear list of attestations for imported products. Those attestations must be presented either in the form of a bilaterally negotiated certificate or as a predetermined generic or sample certificate. In all cases, Ukraine's competent authority controls what is certified. U.S. competent authorities cannot provide their own assertions.

FDA also certifies some processed products. In most cases, the FDA controls those products' production and circulation. Exports of such processed products could be certified either by the FDA or by AMS, as appropriate:

- The FDA may provide this certification in a form the agency determines appropriate. For food products, the FDA provides written certification for exports in the form of certificates and lists of eligible exporters for specific products or destinations.

Export Certificates include Certificates to a Foreign Government, Certificates of Exportability, Certificates of Free Sale, Certificates for Cosmetics, and health certificates for collagen and gelatin for products intended for export to the EU. U.S. exporters are advised to consult with Ukrainian importers about the suitability of offered certificates.
