This GAIN-INDIA report updates FAS New Delhi's (Post) GAIN-INDIA|IN2021-0042|India-Requirement of a Certificate of Non-Genetically Modified and GM-Free Status for Apple Consignments – A Workaround Solution. Effective March 1, 2021, the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare\Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) required a certificate for Non-Genetically Modified (GM) and GM-Free status for all apples, all origins being imported into the country. Summary:

This GAIN-INDIA report updates FAS New Delhi's (Post) GAIN-INDIA IN2021-0042 India-Requirement of a Certificate of Non-Genetically Modified and GM-Free Status for Apple Consignments – A Workaround Solution. Effective March 1, 2021, the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) required a certificate for Non-Genetically Modified (GM) and GM-Free status for all apples, all origins being imported into the country. The certificate, as per the FSSAI notification, shall be issued by an authorized regional (i.e., state level) government authority of the exporting country in the FSSAI specified format.

The Washington State Department of Agriculture, as an authorized regional government authority, will issue Non-GMO and GM-Free status certificate only to its in-state stakeholders exporting apples to India. All interested stakeholders exporting from outside of Washington State must contact their respective State Department of Agriculture to obtain a certificate before exporting apples to India. Report Highlights:

Effective March 1, 2021, the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) requires a certificate for Non-Genetically Modified (GM) and GM-Free status for all apples, all origins being imported into the country. The certificate will be issued by the Washington State Department of Agriculture, in the format prescribed by the FSSAI, as the authorized regional government authority.

GENERAL INFORMATION

On August 21, 2020, the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) issued Order, Requirement of Non-GM cum GM Free Certificate Accompanied with Imported Consignment Reg., effective January 1, 2021, mandating a new requirement for all food imported consignments containing any of 24 specific foods:

The Food Safety and Standards Authority of India specified the requirement of certification by the "competent authority in the exporting country." Following the order's initial publication in August 2020, the FSSAI issued a series of clarifications, including a revised implementation date and permitting certification from regional authorities.

The certificate will reference as well the federal <u>U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA)</u> - <u>Animal and Plant Health Inspection</u> <u>Service (APHIS)</u> phytosanitary certificate number (see, Appendix - VI) which will continue to be issued as usual.
