Report Highlights:

India published guidelines for accepting recycled Polyethylene Terephthalate (rPET) as a food contact material. These guidelines are in alignment with its recently published measure that aims to enhance food safety standards by allowing the use of rPET for food packing, storage, and distribution. The guidelines specify that rPET used for food packaging must adhere to the prescribed quality and safety standards.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

On May 23, 2025, the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) published new guidelines for the use of recycled Polyethylene Terephthalate as a food contact material (FCM-rPET). The main objective of these guidelines is to ensure that recycled materials are safe for direct contact with food. The guidelines outline the process requirements, acceptance criteria for FCM-rPET resin, marking and labeling requirements as well as other documentation requirements for the authorization process. The guidelines apply only to recycling technology approved by FSSAI and exclude production of resins for non-food grade consumer applications.

Background: On March 28, 2025, FSSAI published the Food Safety and Standards (Packaging) First Amendment Regulations, 2025 that allows the use of rPET for food packaging, storage and distribution. This measure by FSSAI supports India's efforts to promote sustainable agricultural and food practices and reduce plastic waste by encouraging the reuse of materials while ensuring food safety. The enforcement date for this measure is set for July 1.
