# **Report Name:** India - FSSAI Publishes Approved List of Specialty Products for Inborn - Congenital - Errors of Metabolism Conditions

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# **Report Highlights:**

On February 22, 2022, India's Ministry of Health and Family Welfare/Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) published Stds/SP-05/Orders/FSSAI (E1317). The order includes a list of conditions associated with inborn (congenital) errors of metabolism (IEM) along with the specialty food products that can be manufactured, sold, marketed, or imported to address these imbalances. The FSSAI implementation date for the approved list is April 1, 2022. Until such time, the FSSAI will continue to allow the import of specialty food products listed in its earlier directive of June 30, 2021.

### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

On February 22, 2022, India's Ministry of Health and Family Welfare/Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) published Stds/SP-05/Orders[*sic*]/FSSAI (E1317). The order includes an approved list of inborn (congenital) errors of metabolism (IEM) conditions along with the specialty food products that can be manufactured, sold, marketed, or imported to address these imbalances (see, Appendix I).

The FSSAI implementation date for the approved list is April 1, 2022. Until such time, the FSSAI will continue to allow the import of specialty food products listed in its earlier directive of June 30, 2021.

**Background:** On December 4, 2020, the FSSAI published the Food Safety and Standards (Foods for Infant Nutrition) Regulations, which contain standards for foods for infants affected by inborn (congenital) errors of metabolism. Subsequently on June 30, 2021, the FSSAI issued a new directive permitting the import of food products for IEM under certain conditions through March 31, 2022 (see, GAIN-INDIA-IN2021-0085-India's FSSAI Extends Compliance Timeline on Specialty Food Products Imports for Inborn Errors of Metabolism and Hypoallergenic Conditions).

# APPENDIX I – FSSAI, STANDARDS OF FOODS FOR INFANTS WITH INBORN (CONGENITAL) ERRORS OF METABOLISM

Reference is drawn to the Food Safety and Standards (Foods for Infant Nutrition) Regulations, 2020 published in Gazette of India on 4th December, 2020, having standards for foods for infants including IEM and the date of compliance of these regulations was extended up to 01<sup>st</sup> April, 2022. In this regard, a direction dated 30.06.2021 was issued to allow the import of food products for IEM conditions till 31.03.2022. Whereas the regulation 16(1) (e) of the above mentioned Regulations provides that "the Food 2. Authority shall specify the IEM conditions as approved by it after undertaking proper scientific evaluation. No Food Business Operator (FBO) shall manufacture, sell, market, or import products for IEM conditions except those specified by the Food Authority from time to time.' 3. In exercise of the power mentioned in the regulation 16(1) (e) as above, the Food Authority has approved the list of IEM conditions as per Annexure I. The list will come into effect from 01<sup>st</sup> April, 2022. Till such time, the direction issued on 30.06.2021 will continue to be in force.
