## **Report Highlights:**

On March 29, 2022, the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare/Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) issued order number Std/SP-05/Orders/FSSAI [E-1317], pertaining to the Food Safety and Standards (Food for Infant Nutrition) Regulations (2020). The new FSSAI order extends the implementation date of the regulations to October 1, 2022. The implementation timeline is being extended by the FSSAI to accommodate industry associations' representations (i.e., written commentary and concerns). Local industry is requiring additional time to reformulate and manufacture infant food products in line with the revised standards' levels for manganese, selenium, biotin, and iron.

# **GENERAL INFORMATION**

On March 29, 2022, the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare/Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) issued order number Std/SP-05/Orders/FSSAI [E-1317], pertaining to the Food Safety and Standards (Food for Infant Nutrition) Regulations (2020). The new FSSAI order extends the implementation date of the regulations to October 1, 2022.

The implementation timeline is being extended by the FSSAI to accommodate industry associations' representations (i.e., written commentary and concerns). Local industry is requiring additional time to reformulate and manufacture infant food products in line with the revised standards' levels for manganese, selenium, biotin, and iron.

In the interim, however, the FSSAI is operationalizing the revised limits of the nutrients for products listed in the FSSAI order as Annexure 1, effective April 1, 2022, onwards. The measure is meant to provide local industry the time needed to phase in new product production while allowing for already manufactured product to be marketed.

3.	<b>Biotin (mcg)</b> For Follow up Formula:	7.50- 50.00	1.60 - 10.60
4.	<b>Iron(mg)</b> For PCCF:	2.00 - 5.65	0.42-1.20
