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## **Report Highlights:**

On June 22, 2021, the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) published a new directive extending its implementation date for standards relating to different categories of infant nutrition foods. Extension of the implementation is being provided to accommodate stakeholders' submissions and to better facilitate the transition for adhering to the new standards requirements. The new implementation date is now set for April 1, 2022.

# **GENERAL INFORMATION:**

On June 22, 2021, the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) published a directive extending the implementation date for standards relating to infant nutrition foods (see, Appendix I). Extension of the implementation is being provided to accommodate stakeholders' submissions and to better facilitate the transition for adhering to the new standards requirements. The new implementation date is now set for April 1, 2022.

The directive states that "representations were received from various stakeholders requesting extension in the time to comply with all the provisions of the new regulations, as the entire portfolio requires reformulation (including stability studies) which is a mammoth and time-consuming activity. It has therefore been decided to extend the transition period for the said regulations up to March 31, 2022. Food Business Operators should comply with all provisions of the said regulation from April 1, 2022."

**Background:** On December 14, 2020, India's FSSAI notified its final Food Safety and Standards (Foods for Infant Nutrition) Regulation pertaining to the different categories of infant nutrition foods (see, <u>GAIN-INDIA</u> (IN2020-0192) Final Standards for Infant Nutrition Foods Published in the Indian Gazette).

### APPENDIX I: FSSAI DIRECTION- EXTENSION OF IMPLEMENTATION DATE FOR FOOD SAFETY AND STANDARDS (INFANT FOODS NUTRITION) REGULATION, 2020

Subject: Direction under Section 16 (5) of Food Safety and Standards Act, 2006 regarding implementation of Food Safety and Standards (Foods for Infant Nutrition) Regulations, 2020.

Reference is drawn to Food Safety and Standards (Foods for Infant Nutrition) Regulations, 2020 dated 04.12.2020 wherein the date of implementation of the said regulations mentioned as 1<sup>st</sup> July,2021.

2. However, representations were received from various stakeholders requesting extension in the time to comply with all the provisions of the new regulations, as the entire portfolio requires reformulation (including stability studies) which is a mammoth & time-consuming activity.

3. After due consideration, it has been decided to extend the transition period for the said regulations upto 31st March,2022. Food Business Operators should comply with all provision of the said regulation from 1<sup>st</sup> April,2022.

4. This issues with the approval of the Competent Authority in exercise of the power vested with Food Authority under Section 16(5) of Food Safety and Standards Act, 2006.
