Report Highlights:

On August 5, 2020, Japan revised the list of agricultural imports that require a phytosanitary certificate (PC). Japan implemented a 3-year transition period for imports previously exempted from the PC requirement. U.S. stakeholders are advised to work with importers to confirm PC requirements with Japan's quarantine officers.

General

In 1950, the <u>Plant Protection Act¹</u> established quarantine regulations for agricultural imports to Japan. In accordance with Article 6 of the Act, Japan requires that agricultural imports be accompanied by a phytosanitary certificate (PC) confirming the absence of quarantine pests. Article 5-3 of the Plant Protection Act identifies products exempted from the PC requirement.

On August 5, 2020, Japan's Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries (MAFF) revised the list of PC exemptions and implemented the updated Plant Protection Act. Japan notified the initial proposal to the World Trade Organization (WTO) in October 2019 (see JA2019-0193). On August 6 2020, Japan updated the WTO notification (<u>G/SPS/N/JPN/684/Add.1</u>) to include a 3-year transition period. Until August 4, 2023, MAFF will allow imports of products which had received an exceptional exemption from the PC requirements, but are now subject to PC requirements, to enter Japan without a PC. FAS Tokyo advises exporters to direct further questions about PC requirements to their contracted importers, who can consult directly with quarantine officers at the expected port of import.

Annex 1 of this report lists products exempted from the PC requirement under Japan's newly revised Plant Protection Act, unless they are listed in Annex 2. Annex 2 lists species and plant parts that require a PC, even if they fall into any of the categories covered in Annex 1.

Annex 1. List of product categories exempted from revised PC requirements

- 1. Dried and compressed plants
- 2. Dried and chopped plants (excluding Senna stem (*Cassia acutifolia*), orange fruits and peels (*Citrus sinensis*) and cassava roots (*Manihot esculenta*))
- 3. Dried and crushed or smashed plants (excluding orange and tamarind fruits (*Tamarindus indica*) and cassava roots)
- 4. Dried plants that are not compressed, chopped, crushed or smashed.
- 5. Frozen plants (excluding shelled walnut)
