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Report Highlights:

The Government of India's (GOI) Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) has proposed amendments in the Food Safety and Standards (Organic Foods) Regulation, 2017, to update specific provisions on organic food labeling and certification. The draft regulation invites comments from World Trade Organization (WTO) member countries, and the comment period expires 60 days after the notification was published on the WTO website (www.wto.org).

On September 3, 2020, FSSAI notified draft amendments to the <u>Food Safety and Standards (Organic Foods)</u> <u>Regulation, 2017</u> on its website. The draft amendments pertain to Chapter 2 titled, "Organic Food Labeling and Certification," and includes additional sub-clauses as detailed below.

(i) in regulation 4, after sub-regulation (2), the following shall be inserted, namely; -

"(3) Aggregators or Intermediaries who collect organic food from small original producer or producer organization and sell it to the end consumer directly are exempted from the provisions of the systems referred in sub-regulation (1). They shall maintain records of traceability and comply with the provisions of anyone of the systems mentioned in sub Regulations (1). Such products shall not carry Food Safety and Standard Authority of India's organic logo."

(ii) in regulation 5, after sub-regulation (2), the following shall be inserted, namely; -

"(3) In-conversion products under PGS-India may be labelled as 'PGS-Green' and may also be labelled as "In-conversion to organic". Conversion products under NPOP may be labelled as "In-conversion to organic' and shall mention the year of conversion. Such In-conversion products shall not carry Food Safety and Standard Authority of India's organic logo."

F.No. Stds/Organic/Notification-01/FSSAI-2019.—The draft of regulations further to amend the Food Safety and Standards (Organic Foods) Regulation, 2017 which the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India proposes to make with the previous approval of the Central Government, in exercise of the powers conferred by clause (v) of sub-section (2) of section 92 read with sub-section (3) of section 22 of the Food Safety and Standards Act, 2006 (34 of 2006), is hereby published, as required by sub-section (1) of section 92 of the said Act for the information of all persons likely to be affected thereby and notice is hereby given that the said draft regulations will be taken into consideration after the expiry of a period of sixty days from the date on which the copies of the Official Gazette in which this notification is published are made available to the public;

Draft Regulations

 (1) These regulations may be called the Food Safety and Standards (Organic Foods) Amendment Regulations, 2020.

(2) They shall come into force with effective date for implementation to be either 1st January or 1st July subject to a minimum of 180 days from the date of their final publication in the official Gazette.
