Report Highlights:

On August 8, 2025, Cambodia implemented zero percent tariffs on U.S. agricultural products, formalized through Sub-decree No. 139, Prakas No. 632, and Instruction No. 3724/25. No implementation issues have been reported to date.

Cambodia Implements Zero Percent Tariffs on U.S. Agricultural Products

On August 8, 2025, the Royal Government of Cambodia implemented zero percent tariffs on U.S. agricultural products. The implementation was formalized through Sub-decree No. 139, Prakas No. 632, and Instruction No. 3724/25. These documents serve as the official record of the tariff reduction's effective date.

Market Impact

The reduction in tariffs is expected to increase demand for U.S. agricultural products in Cambodia. Multiple importers have confirmed that recent shipments of U.S. beef and dairy have been allowed to enter Cambodia duty free.
