**Report Highlights:**

On December 31st last year, the Turkish Ministry of Trade published its 2026 tariff schedule for all commodities including agricultural products. Depending on the prevailing market conditions, the Trade Ministry may at any time during the year decide to adjust tariff rates for selected agricultural product imports. U.S. exporters are encouraged to work with their Turkish clients to confirm tariff rates in advance of shipping.

## **Turkiye Publishes its Annual Tariff Schedule...**

On December 31, 2025, the Turkish Ministry of Trade (MoT) published the country's [2026 tariff schedule](#) (PDF version) in the Official Gazette. For ease of navigating the schedule, an Excel version is attached at the end of this report. Given the size and formatting of Türkiye's tariff schedule, Post was unable to compare the latest schedule with last year's version to assess if there were any meaningful changes.

On the last day of every year, the MoT publishes the tariff schedule for the coming year. Depending on the prevailing market conditions throughout the year, the MoT in consultation with the Ministry of Agriculture and other relevant parties may at any time decide to raise or lower tariffs within the bound rate and will announce any changes in the Official Gazette. Tariff adjustments also include the temporary establishment of zero-duty tariff rate quotas (TRQs). For example, in calendar year 2025, MOT announced several TRQs to facilitate needed corn imports.

## **...But Finding Latest Tariffs Can Be Challenging**

Turkiye has a complex web of tariffs and taxes on imported agricultural products.<sup>1</sup> Navigating the published tariff schedule can be challenging. First, an updated schedule is not published in the Official Gazette every time the government makes changes to individual tariff lines during the year. Second, the format of the schedule makes it hard to search, which is further complicated by the fact that the schedule omits product descriptions. Third, Türkiye uses 12-digit HS codes which can make product classification difficult.<sup>2</sup> For more information about Türkiye's tariff regime, please visit MoT's webpage on [tariffs](#).

To assist local businesses, the MoT has an [online tariff search engine](#) (only in Turkish) that can be used to check the latest tariff information. As there may be potential lags in updates to the search engine, Post strongly encourages U.S. companies to work with their importer or broker to verify the latest tariff (and other taxes).
