For <u>Recent GAIN</u> Cuban country reports published since July 4, 2009; (a) under Custom Date "define target time period", (b) under Categories: select "All Categories", (c) under Countries: select "Cuba", then (d) select "Search".

For <u>Legacy GAIN</u> Cuban country reports published between January 1, 2000 and July 3, 2009, (a) select Option 1, (b) define target time period, (c) under Commodities: select "All Commodities, (d) under Countries: select "Cuba", then (e) select 'Search".

Since implementation of the Trade Sanctions Reform and Export Enhancement Act (TSRA) in 2000, the United States has exported nearly \$5 billion worth of agricultural products to Cuba.

A. Recent Trade Related Reports

- 5. The **U.S. International Trade Commission Report (Publication 3932)** is a 180-page report

published in July 2007 titled "<u>U.S. Agricultural Sales to Cuba: Certain Economic Effects of U.S. Restrictions</u>" that provides estimates for the U.S. export of various agricultural commodities based on different policy scenarios.

B. Food and Agricultural Regulatory Related Reports/Sites

- 6. The <u>2014 Cuba Food and Agricultural Import Regulations and Standards</u> report contains information on known Cuban import requirements for food and agricultural products. Published December 10, 2014
- 7. The USDA's Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) link for <u>Cuba</u> includes information on requirements for U.S. meat and poultry and/or their products exports and FSIS certification
- 8. The **USDA's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS)** link for <u>Cuba</u> includes information on export requirements and APHIS certification for live animals and animal products.

C. Sanctions and U.S. Policy Related Sites

9. The U.S. Department of Commerce (USDOC), Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) website provides U.S. exporters with information on export regulations and controls. On September 21, 2015, the Commerce and Treasury Departments took additional coordinated actions in support of the President's Cuba policy announcement of December 17, 2014. Information related to BIS regulations on license and trade to countries subject to the Trade Sanctions Reform and Export Enhancement Act of 2000 follow:

Exports and Re-exports to Cuba under the Trade Sanctions Reform and Export Enhancement Act

Cuba Licensing Policy

- 10. The **U.S. Treasury Department's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC)** administers the Cuban Assets Control Regulations that regulate travel to Cuba and use of dollars by travelers in Cuba. The OFAC <u>Cuba</u> webpage offers an overview of Cuban assets control regulations and guidelines and information on the Cuba sanctions program, including information on rules related to use of dollars by travelers and permitted travel. Answers to <u>Frequently Asked Questions Related to Cuba</u> were updated on September 18, 2015.
- 11. The **U.S. Department of State** provides general information on <u>Cuba</u> on the U.S. policy towards Cuba, the U.S. Embassy, and details on travel and business, government structure, economic conditions, and trade relations. In addition, this link provides global access to official foreign policy information including daily press briefings, recent health advisories, travel warnings, and public announcements.

12. The **Central Intelligence Agency's (CIA) World Factbook** provides general and current reference information on <u>Cuba</u> including maps, field listings, and Heads of State in the Cuban government, as well

1. The <u>U.S.-Cuba Trade and Economic Council</u> provides an educational structure in which the U.S. business community may access accurate, consistent information and analysis on matters and issues of interest regarding the United States-Republic of Cuba commercial, economic and political relations. The U.S.-Cuba Trade and Economic Council does not take positions with respect to United States-Republic of Cuba political relations. *English only*

- 3. The <u>Federation of International Trade Association</u> website is a well-documented source for trade leads, news, events, and a link library of 4,000+ sites related to international trade such as a Buy/Sell Exchange, Global Trade Shop, and a Directory of US-based Export Management Companies. Applying "Cuba" to the search option can access information on web resources, trade, and events specific to Cuba. *English & Spanish*
- 4. The <u>U.N. Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean</u> website promotes economic and social development in the region, provides advisory services to governments, organizes conferences, and assists in bringing regional perspective to global problems. For Cuba-specific information, the "Search" option will provide a multitude of information on Cuba's political, economic and social situation, past and present. *English & Spanish*
- 5. The Association for the Study of the Cuban Economy (ASCE) is a non-profit, non-political organization incorporated in the state of Maryland in 1990. Its mission is to promote research, publications, and scholarly discussion on the Cuban economy in its broadest sense, including on the social, economic, legal, and environmental aspects of a transition to a free market economy and a democratic society in Cuba. ASCE is affiliated with the American Economic Association and the Allied Social Sciences Association of the United States, and maintains professional contacts with economists inside Cuba —whether independent or associated with the Cuban government—who are interested in engaging in scholarly discussion and research. *English & Spanish*
- 6. The Latin American Network Information Center (LANIC) is part of the Lozano Long Institute of Latin American Studies (LLILAS) and the Benson Latin American Collection at the University of Texas at Austin. Since 2011, LANIC has also been a part of the University of Texas Libraries as one of the initiatives that is under the LLILAS Benson Collaboration. LANIC's mission is to facilitate access to Internet-based information to, from, or on Latin America. LANIC's editorially reviewed directories
