Report Highlights:

On February 7, Japan Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries (MAFF) published a draft guideline for assessment and labeling of greenhouse gas reduction for agricultural products. MAFF has opened the public comment period until February 18, 2024. MAFF intends to implement the labeling scheme by March 2024.

General Information:

Following the establishment of the Strategy for Sustainable Food Systems (MIDORI Strategy) in May 2021 (<u>JA2021-0078</u>), the Government of Japan (GOJ) enacted a legislation to support MIDORI strategy in July 2022 (<u>JA2022-0059</u>). The legislation requires the GOJ to implement a measure to "visualize" environmental impact reduction efforts by farmers (<u>JA2023-0091</u>). Since 2020, the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries (MAFF) has been conducting a pilot project to sell fresh produce with a greenhouse gas (GHG) emission reduction label with over 400 retail outlets throughout Japan.

On February 7, 2024, MAFF published draft operational guidelines for assessment and labeling of GHG reduction and invites comments from the public until February 18, 2024. The proposed guidelines can be found here (Japanese only). In addition to GHG reduction, the proposed guidelines include assessment and labeling schemes for biodiversity conservation. After closing the public comment period, MAFF will finalize the guidelines and implement it by March 2024.
