Export prices of all grades of rice decreased from the previous week: 1-2 percent for white and parboiled rice and 7 percent for fragrant rice. The Thai baht was at its weakest since 2017, falling to 34.82 baht/\$1.00 from the previous week's exchange rate of 34.34 baht/\$1.00. Traders are optimistic about Thai rice exports due to a consistent demand from Middle Eastern countries and other trading partners. In addition, the freight container shortage situation has reportedly eased with less congestion. Domestic rice prices also dropped 3-4 percent from the previous week.

Rice Export Update

Unofficial and preliminary rice exports (excluding Hom Mali fragrant rice) for May 30 – June 5, 2022, totaled 101,211 metric tons, down 10,426 metric tons from the previous week and down 13,337 metric tons from the four-week moving average of 114,548 metric tons (Table 2). Rice exports from January 1 – June 5, 2022, totaled 2,404,227 metric tons, up 77 percent from the same period last year.

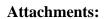

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, between May 1, 2013, and December 18, 2016, export data did not include 25% -100% grade white rice exports as the reporting authority was moved from the Thai Board of Trade to the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards, which does not release official export data. FAS/BKK reports only the official export numbers available from the Board of Trade of Thailand. The reader should bear in mind these differences when comparing historical data with current data.
