Report Highlights:

Rice export prices mostly remained unchanged as rising domestic rice prices offset the weakening of the Thai baht.

Export prices of most grades of rice remained unchanged despite the weakening of the Thai baht to 36.15 baht/\$1.00 from the previous week's exchange rate of 35.49 baht/\$1.00. Thai rice prices were comparable to Vietnamese rice prices, which helped boost Thai rice competitiveness. Domestic rice prices went up 2-5 percent from the previous week as traders are securing rice supplies to fulfill contracted shipments. In the first five months of 2022, Thai rice exports rose to 2.74 million metric tons, up 50 percent from the same period last year, mainly due to increased white rice exports, especially to Iraq, China, Japan, and the Philippines.

Rice Export Update

Unofficial and preliminary rice exports (excluding Hom Mali fragrant rice) for June 27 – July 3, 2022, totaled 117,711 metric tons, down 38,431 metric tons from the previous week and down 11,033 metric tons from the four-week moving average of 128,744 metric tons (Table 2). Rice exports from January 1 – July 3, 2022, totaled 2,919,172 metric tons, up 74 percent from the same period last year.

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, between May 1, 2013, and December 18, 2016, export data did not include 25% -100% grade white rice exports as the reporting authority was moved from the Thai Board of Trade to the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards, which does not release official export data. FAS/BKK reports only the official export numbers available from the Board of Trade of Thailand. The reader should bear in mind these differences when comparing historical data with current data.
