Export prices for most rice grades increased 1-2 percent from the previous week as demand picked up, especially from Indonesia, Philippines, and Malaysia. Yet, rice exporters expressed concern over the recent depreciation of the Thai baht (\$1=35.07 baht) compared to the exchange rate last week (\$1=34.97 baht). Similarly, domestic rice prices in Thailand grew 1-3 percent compared to the prior week as rice mills reportedly offered higher purchase prices for new MY2022/23 off-season rice supplies.

## **Rice Export Update**

Unofficial and preliminary rice exports (excluding Hom Mali fragrant rice) for August 14 - 20, 2023, totaled 147,849 metric tons, up 23,365 metric tons from the previous week and up 18,711 metric tons from the four-week moving average of 129,138 metric tons (Table 2). Rice exports from January 1 to August 20, 2023, totaled 3,996,838 metric tons, up 4.3 percent compared to the same period last year.

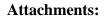

**Note on data:** Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, between May 1, 2013, and December 18, 2016, the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards took over reporting authority for rice exports and at that time the export data did not include 25% -100% grade white rice exports. Prior to May 1, 2013 and since December 18, 2016, the Thai Board of Trade has reported rice export data, which includes 25%-100% grade white rice. The reader should bear in mind these differences when comparing historical data with current data.
