## **Report Highlights:**

Thailand's domestic and export prices grew 1-3 percent as demand for Thai rice surges in response to rice export bans by India and Burma.

Export and domestic prices of most rice grades jumped 1-3 percent from the previous week as foreign rice demand picked up in response to India's ban on non-basmati rice and Burma's 2-month rice export restriction that went into effect on September 1, 2023. Thai rice prices increased \$43-60/MT between July and August 2023. Still, this week Thai rice prices were \$10-60/MT below Vietnamese rice so Thai rice looked more competitive on the global market. Nevertheless, rice exporters expressed concern about the volatility and potential further depreciation of the Thai baht (\$1=35.25 baht this week and last week \$1=35.07 baht).

## **Rice Export Update**

Thailand's unofficial and preliminary rice exports (excluding Hom Mali fragrant rice) for August 21 – 27, 2023, totaled 127,505 metric tons, down 20,344 metric tons from the previous week and down 2,356 metric tons from the four-week moving average of 129,861 metric tons (Table 2). Rice exports from January 1 to August 27, 2023, totaled 4,124,343 metric tons, up 3.0 percent compared to the same period last year.

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, between May 1, 2013, and December 18, 2016, the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards took over reporting authority for rice exports and at that time the export data did not include 25% -100% grade white rice exports. Prior to May 1, 2013, and since December 18, 2016, the Thai Board of Trade has reported rice export data, which includes 25%-100% grade white rice. The reader should bear in mind these differences when comparing historical data with current data.
