Report Highlights:

Thailand's domestic and export prices dropped 1-3 percent in response to reduced demand and a further weakening of the Thai baht.

Export and domestic prices for all rice grades dropped 1-3 percent from the previous week primarily due to the lack of new purchase orders. Industry contacts suggest that the higher rice prices over recent weeks have dampened overseas demand. This week, the export prices for Thai white rice were still 35 percent higher than the 5-year average and 41 percent higher than in the same period last year. In addition, the Thai baht further depreciated (\$1=35.37 baht) compared to the exchange rate last week (\$1=35.25 baht).

Rice Export Update

Unofficial and preliminary rice exports (excluding Hom Mali fragrant rice) for August 28 – September 3, 2023, totaled 84,119 metric tons, down 43,386 metric tons from the previous week and down 36,870 metric tons from the four-week moving average of 120,989 metric tons (Table 2). Rice exports from January 1 to September 3, 2023, totaled 4,208,462 metric tons, up 1.2 percent compared to the same period last year.

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, between May 1, 2013, and December 18, 2016, the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards took over reporting authority for rice exports and at that time the export data did not include 25% -100% grade white rice exports. Prior to May 1, 2013, and since December 18, 2016, the Thai Board of Trade has reported rice export data, which includes 25%-100% grade white rice. The reader should bear in mind these differences when comparing historical data with current data.
