Demand for Thai rice remains strong, driven by ASEAN buyers, especially in Indonesia and the Philippines. Compared to the previous week, export prices across Thai rice grades dropped one percent as the Thai baht further depreciated from \$1=35.37 baht last week to \$1=35.54 baht in the week ending on September 19.

The Ministry of Commerce's Department of Foreign Trade reported that Thai rice exports between January – August 2023 totaled 5.36 million metric tons, up 12 percent from the same period last year, as India and Burma imposed rice export bans. Indonesia, the Philippines, and Malaysia are the primary Thai rice export destinations.

## **Rice Export Update**

Unofficial and preliminary rice exports (excluding Hom Mali fragrant rice) for September 4-10, 2023, totaled 108,883 metric tons, up 24,764 metric tons from the previous week and down 8,206 metric tons from the four-week moving average of 117,089 metric tons (Table 2). Rice exports from January 1 to September 10, 2023, totaled 4,317,345 metric tons, up 0.9 percent compared to the same period last year.

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, between May 1, 2013, and December 18, 2016, the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards took over reporting authority for rice exports and at that time the export data did not include 25% -100% grade white rice exports. Prior to May 1, 2013, and since December 18, 2016, the Thai Board of Trade has reported rice export data, which includes 25%-100% grade white rice. The reader should bear in mind these differences when comparing historical data with current data.
