Report Highlights:

Thailand's export prices fell 1-2 percent, mainly due to further weakening of the Thai baht.

Rice export prices across Thai rice grades dropped 1-2 percent as the Thai baht depreciated from \$1=36.23 baht last week to \$1=36.90 baht in the week ending on October 3. The weaker Thai baht improves the price competitiveness of Thai rice relative to Vietnamese rice currently priced \$22-57/MT over Thai white rice prices. Domestic rice prices remain unchanged from the previous week as the local rice mills reportedly still hold inventories and are waiting for new crop rice supplies, particularly of fragrant rice, to enter the market.

Thailand's Geo-Informatics and Space Technology Development Agency (GISTDA) reported that September 26 to October 2, 2023 heavy rains affected 236,790 rai (37,886 hectares) of agricultural land, including MY2023/24 main-crop rice areas, in the Northeastern region.

Rice Export Update

Unofficial and preliminary rice exports (excluding Hom Mali fragrant rice) for September 18 – 24, 2023, totaled 146,390 metric tons, down 9,492 metric tons from the previous week and up 22,571 metric tons from the four-week moving average of 123,819 metric tons (Table 2). Rice exports from January 1 to September 24, 2023, totaled 4,619,618 metric tons, up 0.5 percent compared to the same period last year.

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, between May 1, 2013, and December 18, 2016, the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards took over reporting authority for rice exports and at that time the export data did not include 25% -100% grade white rice exports. Prior to May 1, 2013, and since December 18, 2016, the Thai Board of Trade has reported rice export data, which includes 25%-100% grade white rice. The reader should bear in mind these differences when comparing historical data with current data.
