Report Highlights:

Rice export prices increased 1-2 percent due to the strong demand for Thai rice and the strengthening of the Thai baht.

Export prices rice rose 1-2 percent from the previous week as the Thai baht strengthened to \$1.00=34.86 baht from the previous week's exchange rate of \$1.00=35.48 baht. Strong demand for Thai rice, especially white rice, from ASEAN countries has also driven Thai rice prices upward. Thai white rice prices were \$20-62/MT below Vietnamese rice exports, which made Thai rice more attractive in the world market. In addition, domestic farm-gate prices grew 1-2 percent from the previous week.

Rice Export Update

Unofficial and preliminary rice exports (excluding Hom Mali fragrant rice) for December 4–10, 2023, totaled 185,426 metric tons, down 1,739 metric tons from the previous week and down 8,157 metric tons from the four-week moving average of 193,583 metric tons (Table 2). Rice exports from January 1 to December 10, 2023, totaled 6,500,668 metric tons, up 7.5 percent compared to the same period last year.

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, between May 1, 2013, and December 18, 2016, the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards took over reporting authority for rice exports and at that time the export data did not include 25% -100% grade white rice exports. Prior to May 1, 2013, and since December 18, 2016, the Thai Board of Trade has reported rice export data, which includes 25%-100% grade white rice. The reader should bear in mind these differences when comparing historical data with current data.
