Report Highlights:

Export rice prices grew one percent despite the weakening of the Thai baht, as exporters secured rice supplies to fulfill contracted shipments to ASEAN countries.

Export prices for most grades of rice increased one percent from the week of December 26, 2023, as exporters are securing rice supplies to fulfill the contracted shipments of white and parboiled rice to ASEAN countries. Domestic farm-gate rice prices also increased as farmers already completed their MY2023/24 main-crop white paddy rice harvest. Meanwhile, the Thai baht weakened to \$1.00=34.73 baht from the previous week's exchange rate of \$1.00=34.12 baht. In addition, Thai rice exporters are concerned about the 3 to 4 times increase in the freight rate since mid-December 2023 as major container shipping lines reportedly reroute their vessels, in response to unrest in the Red Sea.

Rice Export Update

Unofficial and preliminary rice exports (excluding Hom Mali fragrant rice) for December 25 - 31, 2023, totaled 132,475 metric tons, down 37,463 metric tons from the previous week and down 38,152 metric tons from the four-week moving average of 170,627 metric tons (Table 2). Rice exports from January 1 to December 31, 2023, totaled 6,997,751 metric tons, up 8.7 percent compared to the same period last year.

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, between May 1, 2013, and December 18, 2016, the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards took over reporting authority for rice exports and at that time the export data did not include 25% -100% grade white rice exports. Prior to May 1, 2013, and since December 18, 2016, the Thai Board of Trade has reported rice export data, which includes 25%-100% grade white rice. The reader should bear in mind these differences when comparing historical data with current data.
