Export prices for most grades of rice decreased around one percent despite the Thai baht strengthening \$1.00=35.20 baht from the previous week's exchange rate of \$1.00=35.47 baht. Foreign buyers are reportedly waiting for the new MY2023/24 off-season rice supply to enter the market in late February – early March. Currently, export prices of Thailand's 5 percent grade white rice are \$25/MT higher than Vietnamese rice, which make Thai rice less competitive globally, particularly in Indonesia. Meanwhile, domestic rice prices rose 1-2 percent from the same period last week as rice exporters are securing rice supplies to fulfill their contracted shipments ahead of the Lunar New Year holiday and the month of Ramadan.

Rice Export Update

Unofficial and preliminary rice exports (excluding Hom Mali fragrant rice) for January 15-21, 2024, totaled 182,854 metric tons, up 1,953 metric tons from the previous week and up 38,280 metric tons from the four-week moving average of 144,574 metric tons (Table 2). Rice exports from January 1 to 21, 2024, totaled 445,822 metric tons, up 35 percent compared to the same period last year.

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, between May 1, 2013, and December 18, 2016, the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards took over reporting authority for rice exports and at that time the export data did not include 25% -100% grade white rice exports. Prior to May 1, 2013, and since December 18, 2016, the Thai Board of Trade has reported rice export data, which includes 25%-100% grade white rice. The reader should bear in mind these differences when comparing historical data with current data.
