Rice export prices further dropped one percent due to the weakening of the Thai baht.

Rice export prices further dropped one percent from the previous week due to the weakening of the Thai baht to \$1.00=36.68 baht from the previous week's exchange rate of \$1.00=36.65 baht. Meanwhile, farm-gate prices for white and fragrant paddy rice remain steady relative to the previous week along with domestic rice prices even amid tight supplies of MY 2023/24 offseason new-crop rice.

Department of Foreign Trade, Ministry of Commerce reported that during January 1 to May 31, 2024, Thai rice exports totaled 4.6 million metric tons, up 32 percent from the same period last year. The main markets for Thai rice during the first 5 months of 2024 were Indonesia, Iraq, the United States, the Philippines, and South Africa. Thailand benefited from India's rice export ban and the weakening of the Thai baht, which boosted Thai rice export competitiveness.

Rice Export Update

Unofficial and preliminary rice exports (excluding Hom Mali fragrant rice) for June 3 - 9, 2024, totaled 157,113 metric tons, down 50,148 metric tons from the previous week and down 28,824 metric tons from the four-week moving average of 185,937 metric tons (Table 2). Rice exports from January 1 to June 9, 2024, totaled 3,848,753 metric tons, up 40 percent compared to the same period last year.

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, between May 1, 2013, and December 18, 2016, the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards took over reporting authority for rice exports and at that time the export data did not include 25% -100% grade white rice exports. Prior to May 1, 2013, and since December 18, 2016, the Thai Board of Trade has reported rice export data, which includes 25%-100% grade white rice. The reader should bear in mind these differences when comparing historical data with current data.
