Export prices for all grades of rice decreased from the previous week as trade activities slowed and the Thai baht appreciated against the U.S. dollar. There are only a few new inquiries with most of them coming from African markets for white and parboiled rice. There is increasing concern of the competitiveness of Thai rice. The Thai government is looking into new varieties to help meet demand, reduce export prices, and increase rice quality. The MY2020/21 off-season rice harvest is continuing with approximately 15 percent remaining to be harvested, around 0.87 million rai (138,789 hectare). The Thai baht further strengthened against the U.S. dollar to 31.04 baht/U.S. \$1.00 from the previous week's exchange rate of 31.18 baht/U.S. \$1.00.

# **Rice Export Update**

Unofficial and preliminary rice exports (excluding Hom Mali fragrant rice) for May 24 - 30, 2021, totaled 34,790 metric tons, down 40,792 metric tons from the previous week and down 36,987 metric tons from the four-week moving average of 71,777 metric tons (Table 2). Rice exports from January 1 - May 30, 2021, totaled 1,290,529 metric tons, down 27 percent from the same period last year.

**Note on data:** Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, between May 1, 2013 and December 18, 2016, export data did not include 25% -100% grade white rice exports as the reporting authority was moved from the Thai Board of Trade to the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards, which does not release official export data. FAS/BKK reports only the official export numbers available from the Board of Trade of Thailand. The reader should bear in mind these differences when comparing historical data with current data.
