Export prices further increased 3-5 percent from the previous week due to demand for white rice from the Indonesian government. Sources reported that the Indonesian government decided to purchase 120,000 metric tons of Thai 5% grade white rice for immediate shipment by February 2018. Also, Thai rice exporters are securing white and parboiled rice to fulfill their shipment contracts of 5% grade white rice to the Philippines and parboiled rice to African countries, Benin in particular. Additionally, the Thai baht further strengthened to 31.67 baht/U.S. \$1.00, compared to 31.80 baht/U.S. \$1.00 from the previous week.

Rice Export Update

Unofficial and preliminary rice exports (excluding premium white and fragrant rice) for January 8-14, 2018, totaled 199,583 metric tons, up 94,744 metric tons from the previous week and up 36,146 metric tons from the four-week moving average of 163,437 metric tons (Table 2). Rice exports from January 1-14, 2018, totaled 304,422 metric tons.

In addition, during May 1, 2013 - December 18, 2016, export data did not include 25% - 100% grade white rice exports as the reporting authority was moved from the Thai Board of Trade to the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards, which does not release official export data. FAS/BKK reports only the official export numbers available from the Board of Trade of Thailand. The reader should bear in mind these differences when comparing historical data with current data.</i></p>
