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Report Highlights:

The wheat planting area for MY2023/24 is estimated at 725,000 HA, some 17 percent higher than previous marketing year. Overall production is estimated to be 3.6 MMT, which represents a 12.5 increase compared to MY2022/23. With domestic consumption of around 1.7 MMT, and huge beginning stocks of 1.2 MMT, Serbia will have 2.5 MMT of wheat available for export in MY2023/24. Serbia also started the MY2022/23 for wheat with larger ending stocks than usual, mostly due to the record-breaking crop in MY2021/22, and to a great extent the ban and export restrictions that significantly hindered regular export flows March-July 2022. Due to extremely high domestic wheat prices, ban and restrictions on exports in MY2022/23, Serbia will export maximum 750,000 MT.



Summary:

Serbia began MY2022/23 with larger wheat ending stocks than usual, mostly due to the record-breaking crop in MY2021/22, and to a great extent the ban and export restrictions that significantly hindered regular export flows March-July 2022 resulting in wheat ending stocks in MY2021/22 of more than 700,000 MT in July 2022.

In MY2021/22 Serbia's wheat crop was more than 3.2 MMT. Serbia's domestic wheat consumption averages about 140,000 MT monthly (for all purposes). This represents annual consumption of 1.7 MMT.

After the export of 690,000 MT of wheat July 2022 to May 2023 followed by wheat exports of around 60,000 MT in June 2023, Serbia's total wheat export in MY2022/23 may reach as much as 750,000 MMT. According to Serbian Grain Association data, Serbia's ending stocks in MY2022/23 will be a record high of over 1.2 MMT.

The planting area for wheat for MY2023/24 is estimated at 725,000 HA, some 17 percent higher than the previous marketing year. Overall production is estimated to be 3.6 MMT, which represents a 12.5 increase compared to MY2022/23. With domestic consumption of around 1.7 MMT, and huge beginning stock of 1.2 MMT, Serbia will have 2.5 MMT of wheat available for export in MY2023/24.

Although in MY2023/24 the area planted with wheat was a record, leaf spot and other diseases will impact the final results. An extremely warm winter and significant differences in temperature between day and night with a higher percentage of moisture in the soil led to yellow rust and yellow brown spotting in wheat. Diseases are present on most of the wheat but at different levels depending on the location and wheat variety. Frequent rainfall during the flowering period created serious problems for wheat producers, especially Fusarium which will further delay the assessment of the new crop. It is certain that Serbia will not have record wheat production in MY2023/24, but the final estimated production will be available in June. The wheat harvest is expected to start by the end of June due to very wet fields.

In MY2022/23 wheat exports for July 2022 - May 2023 were 680,000 MT of which the majority, 230,000 MT was exported to Italy by rail or trucks. Some quantities of wheat were exported to neighboring countries (Croatia, Albania, Kosovo, Bosnia and Herzegovina, North Macedonia). This year only 128,000 MT was exported by river vessels via Danube River to the Black Sea Port of Constanza, Romania.

Current wheat prices decreased more than 40 percent between July 2022 to June 2023. Wheat prices rose in the fall when the November 2022 Novi Sad Commodity Exchange was 40 dinars kg (\$365/MT). Since there were limited exports during the fall and winter months, wheat prices declined in January 2023 reaching 35 dinars/kg (\$320/MT) and declined even lower in March 2023 at 27 dinars/kg

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(\$245/MT). There was a record high ending stocks price for wheat but the price declined rapidly in March, reaching a low of 17 dinars/kg (\$187/MT) in the beginning of June 2023.
